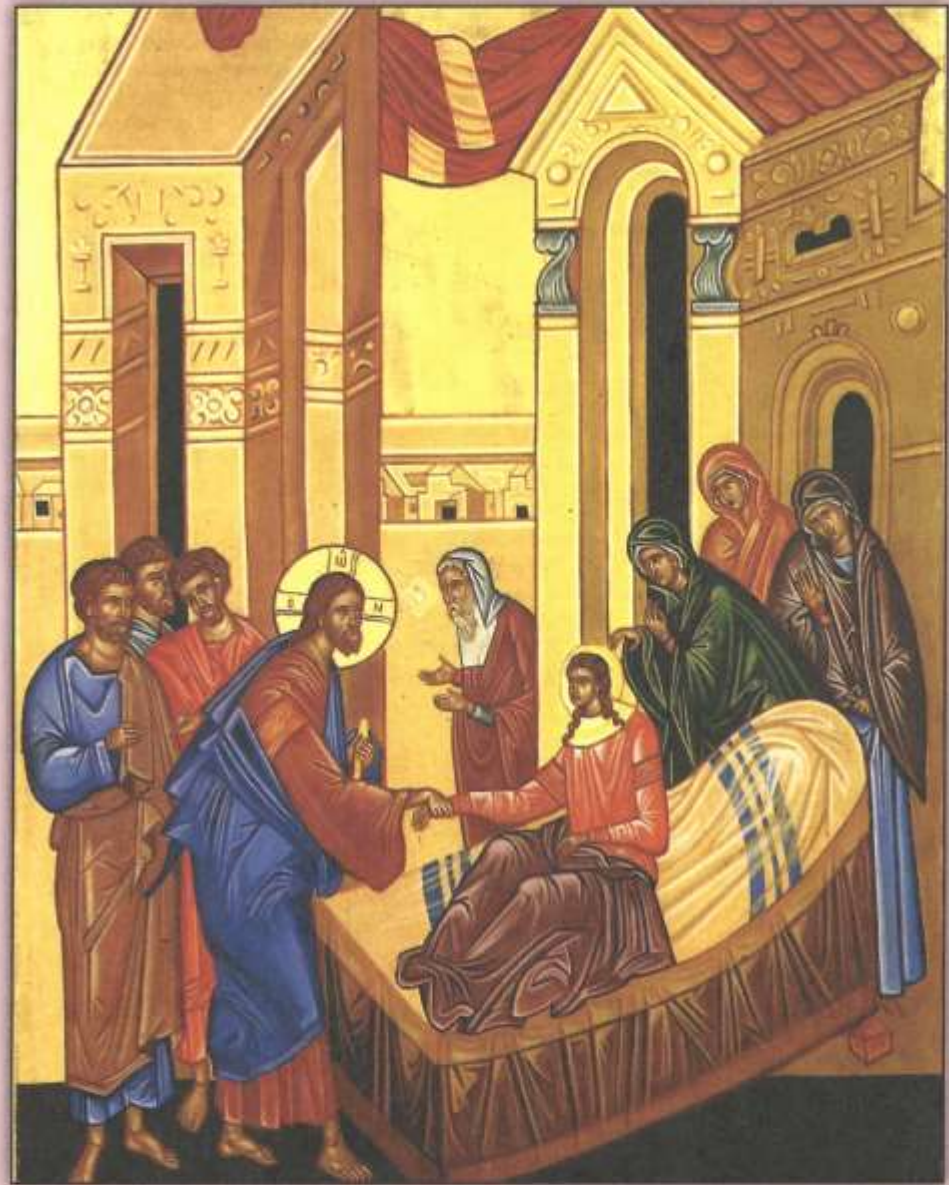
Two Miracles Attest that Jesus is the Resurrection and Life
