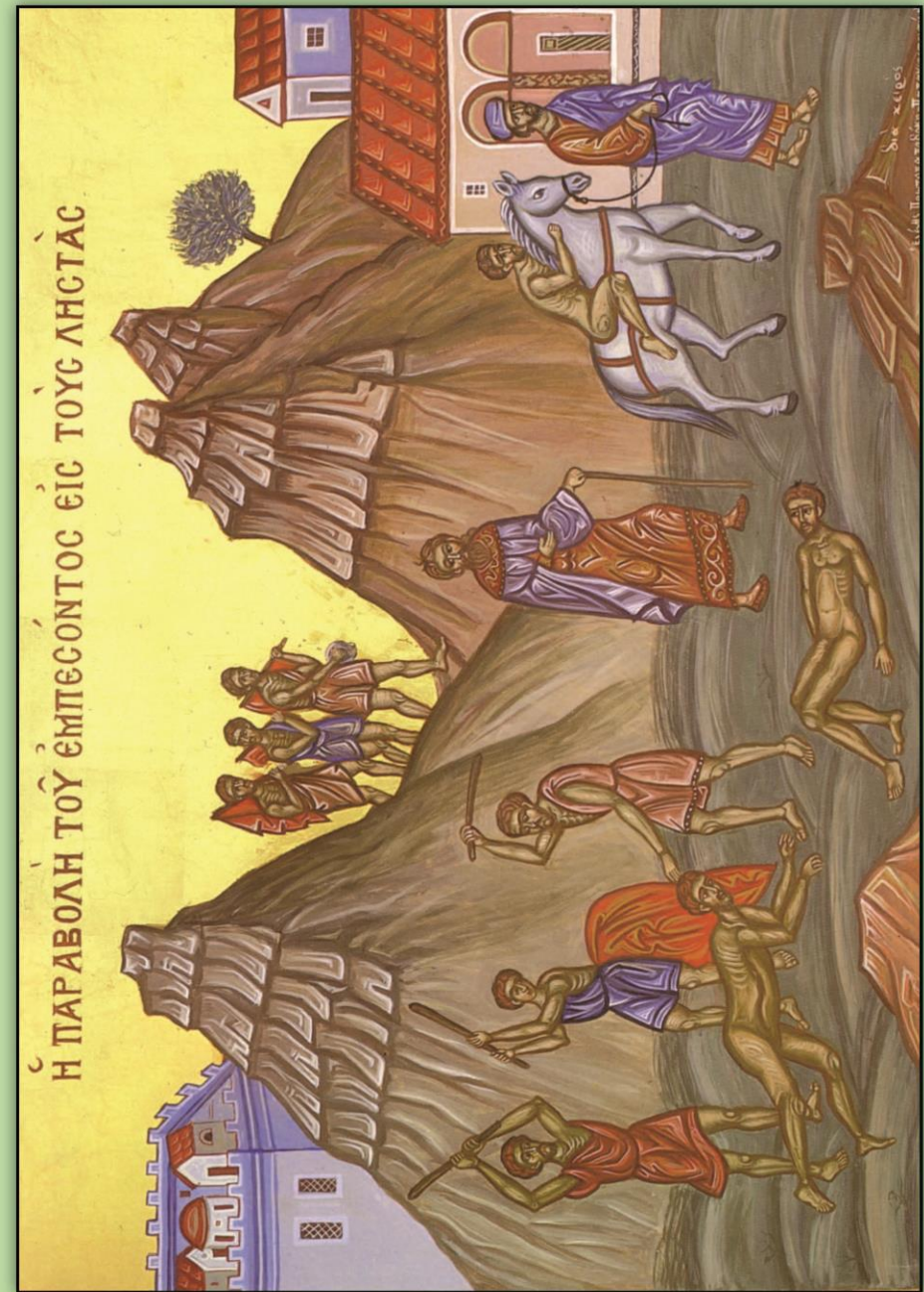

Let us act wisely; let us honor Christ as He Himself wishes to be honored; the most acceptable honor to one whom we would honor is the honor which He desired, not that we ourselves imagine.

Peter thought he was honoring his Master by not letting the Lord wash his feet; and yet it was just the opposite. Give Him the honor which He Himself has asked for, by giving your money to the poor. Once again, what God wants is not golden chalices, but golden souls.

COVID-10 LOCKDOWN

Due to the recent status upgrade to code RED in Manitoba, the directives from the provincial government state that religious and cultural gatherings must close or be provided virtually only. Dr. Roussin added the new restrictions will be in effect for at least two weeks, but likely for two incubation periods of four weeks. Travel is to be limited to essential services only.

His Grace Archbishop Lawrence released the following directives today on 11 November 2020.

- 1. Regular Liturgies - especially the Sunday and daily Divine Liturgies - may be celebrated for the public online (e.g. via livestreaming) but may not be attended in person. To realize the livestreaming Liturgies, there may be three (3) persons in attendance - a member of the clergy, a cantor and a technician to operate the broadcasting system.
2. For Weddings and Funerals [and Baptisms] a maximum of five (5) persons may be present as well as the presiding member of the clergy.
3. Questions concerning reception of Holy Communion and Confession, etc. outside the context of the Divine Liturgy; will be decided as soon as possible. In the meantime, the Faithful should be encouraged to practice Spiritual Holy Communion and the Act of Contrition as described in earlier statements. Please be informed that since we are not livestreaming

from St. Mary's in Brandon or Portage, Churches will be closed for the duration of time prescribed by the province until further notice. Virtual services will be provided by parishes in Winnipeg. Sunday sermons will be available for each Sunday during lockdown.

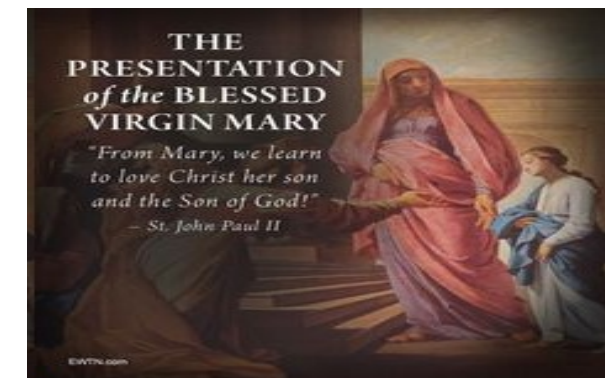
