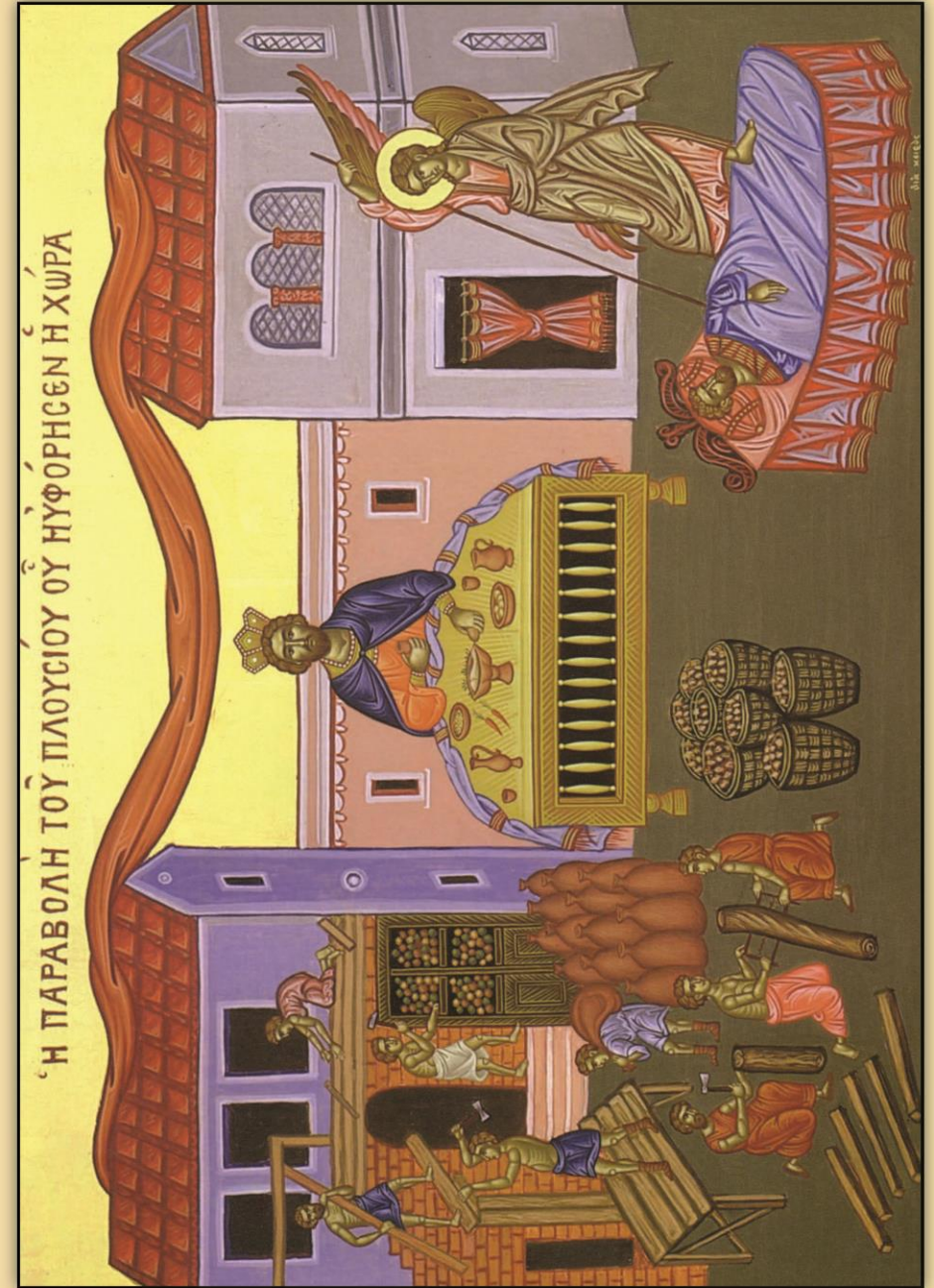
It gives him no pain nor awakens his pity. Still more irrational, he settles for himself

HOLY TRADITION

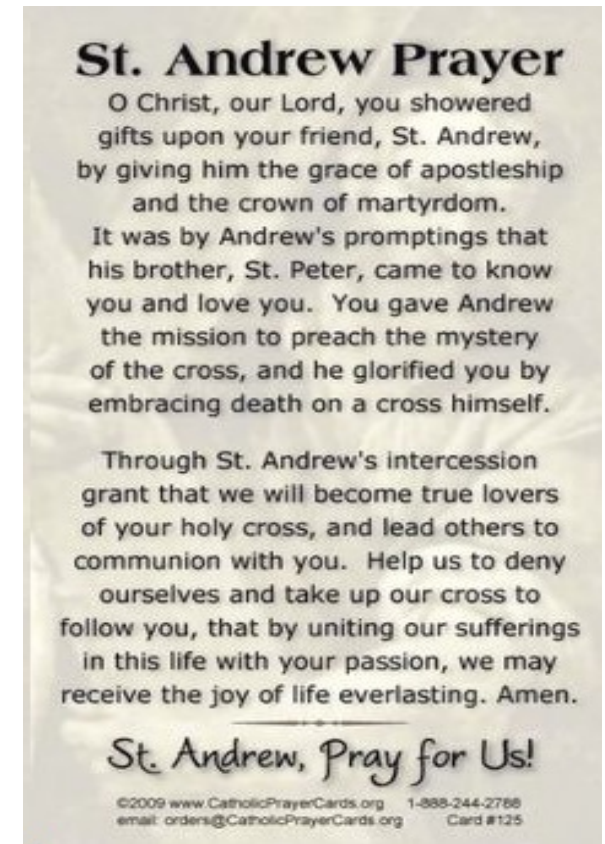
The truths of divine revelation which have not been written down in the pages of the Holy Bible, but have been transmitted by word of mouth, are called Tradition. Tradition comprises the teachings of Christ which are not clearly contained in the Holy Bible but were preached by the Apostles and their successors and throughout the centuries by the universal Church. The word "tradition" is derived from the Latin 'tradere' meaning to hand down. Many truths of Tradition may be read today in sermons preached by the early Fathers of the Church and may be found illustrated in paintings and other works of art, some of which date back to the earliest Christian times. This is Tradition in its narrower sense. In a broader sense Tradition includes the entire teaching of the Church and Holy Scripture. St. Paul writes: "Therefore, brethren, stand fast; and hold the traditions which you have learned, whether by word, or by our epistles" (2 Thessalonians 2:14). The apostles received from our Lord the command to preach and not to write. Christ, Himself did not write any book, nor did He tell His apostles to write. He sent them to proclaim the Gospel. After Pentecost they began to preach in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria and to the ends of the earth. Thus in the beginning Christianity began to spread by preaching. As the Christian communities began to grow larger and larger, the Apostles would write letters about the teachings of Christ or a history about His life and works. Their writings about Christ and His

doctrine were incomplete as St. John testifies, that even the whole world not hold all the books that would have to be written (John 21:25).
